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2019 JOSIE REWALD SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION CRITERIA

Essay (40 percent)

On a separate sheet of paper write a **one page (single or double spaced, your choice)** essay. The topic of the essay is: Tell us why you want to enter a STEM² field and how this scholarship would help you. This is not a research paper, this is an essay of your thoughts. The essay will be scored on grammar, spelling, neatness, creativity, and content.

Awards/Honors (20 percent)

On a separate sheet of paper, list the **top five** awards and honors which you have received during the past three years. Also, **state the basis of selection for each award**. Make sure to define any acronyms. Please limit list to one page.

An example of the required format is provided below:

1. Science Department Award, 2013 - 3 years of academic excellence in science courses

Leadership, Activities and Employment (30 percent)

On a separate sheet of paper, list the most important activities (job, community, church, school, sports etc.) in which you have been involved with during the past three years. Include any offices or leadership positions held, hours per week, and what you learned or gained from the experience. Please limit your activities to the three most important activities per year (a **maximum total of nine activities**). An example of the required format is provided below:

- Year: 2017
1. Activity or Employment: Varsity Basketball
Office held: None
Hours per week: January - March 15 hours per week
What you learned or gained: Teamwork and dedication
 2. Activity or Employment: Flower Shop
Office held: Assistant Manager
Hours per week: September - December 15 hours per week
April - June 20 hours per week
What you learned or gained: Responsibility, ability to deal with customers

Letters of Recommendation (10 percent)

Recommendations must be professional and should come from teachers, school administrators, school counselors, employers, clergy or other adult mentors in your life. Recommendations from family members or personal friends will not be accepted.
